

What are drug cryptomarkets? (darknet markets)

- Cryptomarkets are digital platforms that use anonymising software (e.g. Tor) and cryptocurrencies (e.g. Bitcoin) to facilitate trade of goods and services.
- All kinds of drugs are sold: illicit, novel, pharmaceutical
- It's been 13 years ... Silk Road began in Feb 2011
- Vendor ratings are collated and utilised by buyers to discern best quality and service
- Typically delivered through the postal system
- Decentralised and globalised drug exchanges





THE INTERNET: CLEAR WEB, DEEP WEB AND DARK WEB

Internet

Infrastructure consisting of a standardized set of data transfer protocols for digital information exchange.



Clear web (surface web)


Content indexed by standard web-search engines, accessible to anyone using the Internet.

- social networks
- public pages /profiles



Dark web (darknets)

Darknets, or overlay networks within the Internet that can only be accessed with specific software, configurations, or authorization, and often use a unique customized communication protocol. Two typical darknet types are social networks (usually used for file hosting with a peer-topeer connection), and anonymity proxy networks such as Tor via an anonymized series of connections.





Deep web

Content not indexed by standard web-search engines; content can be located and accessed by a direct URL or IP address but may require a password or other security access to get past public-website pages; includes many very common uses such as web mail, online banking, private or otherwise restricted access content and profiles.

- restricted pages /profiles

Learning to buy and sell...

- But actors must learn:
 - 1. Tor/12P (anonymous access to marketplaces)
 - 2. PGP (encrypting messages between actors)
 - 3. Bitcoin/Monero (non-cash payment without identity disclosure)



- Young males, of higher than average education & employment
- Almost all (95%) have used illicit drugs before
- Most popular drugs bought are MDMA, cannabis, cocaine, LSD
- Reasons for use: convenience, quality, range, ratings, price



- Of darknet sample, median age 24 years, 80% identify as cis men, 34% report having a university degree
- Cannabis, psychedelics, MDMA still popular but also opioids and dissociatives




Figure 4. An invite-link for a large drug server posted to the main chat of another drug server.

Why use apps for drug trading #1

Immediacy and convenience

"It just seemed like a simple, modern way to buy things. I'd gotten pretty sick of the darknet because I never really got it, so had to always have a friend on hand to help me out. With apps its super simple, I get it and in no time I've managed to connect with strangers who I would've never been able to access before. Plenty of dealers in this area exist solely on Snapchat, so without it, I would've kept relying on people approaching me in the street or randomly bumping into people in clubs."

Why use apps for drug trading #2

Visual dealing practices – 'seeing' quality

"The first time I bought Xanax it was through Snapchat because I could watch the dealer opening sealed packets on his story before he sold them and I therefore felt safe consuming them...I would never buy anything I hadn't tried before from some guy on a street corner or anything at all really unless I was desperate."

Law enforcement and detection – ephemeral messaging

"I realised rather rapidly that Snapchat was totally secure, as was WhatsApp. Law enforcement agencies cannot [access] any data transmitted over these apps as was recently proven by several high-profile cases."

Cryptomarket vendors are:

Offering messaging apps as alternative trading platform

- Convenience+ (especially when vendor/buyer reln already established)
- Discounts offered (commission to cryptomarket not needed)

the practice of purchasing drugs for resale via apps to social networks

"I'm rather talented with computers and managed to find my way onto the darknet markets pretty easily, where the quality and the price was incredible, and super easy to make a profit off of. So I started buying off the darknet, and selling to friends, in which case using messaging apps came in very handy, especially with the secure/disappearing nature of them."
